As the 1950's drew to a close, major changes were rolling through the British music scene. The new audience of affluent teens was in the driving seat and their musical idols were American: Chuck Berry, Elvis, the Everly Brothers, Ricky Nelson and others. Teens like your narrator who dug modern jazz

were seeing their jazz clubs become rock clubs. Our nattily dressed London-based jazz heroes were being displaced by self-taught, guitar twanging, fuzzy chinned teens in leather jackets.

Liverpool, a major port city in the north of England, was becoming a melting pot of embryonic bands which mostly played covers of American R&B. In 1957, two of those teens began writing their own songs, to be played by their then band, the Quarrymen. The two teens were John Lennon and Paul McCartney and over the course of their partnership they wrote some 180 songs.

One, "Yesterday", was later listed by the Guinness Book of World Records as the "Most Recorded Song in History". Many were written by one or the other partner, but it was rare that any would be completed without some input from the other. However, they had an informal agreement that each would be fully credited. Lennon once described their writing style as "Writing eyeball-to-eyeball" and "Playing into each other's nose".

In 1963 the partners had their first UK Top 20 hit, "Love Me Do", played by their reinvented band now called "The Beatles". Paul had started to write this song in 1957when he was about 15. John and Paul were heralded as "the outstanding English composers of 1963". This groundbreaking (and moneymaking) musical partnership lasted until Lennon announced, in 1969, that he was leaving.

And then, in 1980, John Lennon was shot dead in New York City. Asked recently if he missed writing with Lennon, McCartney was quick to respond "Are you kidding? I really had the greatest writing partner...".

He went on to say "We loved doing it, it was a very interesting thing to try to learn to do, to become songwriters. I think that why we eventually got so strong was that we wrote so much during our formative period."

Tonight their work will be interpreted in the jazz idiom by our own musical artists, the Guffman Trio and Friends.
