When moving into a new home, deciding where to place things is a challenge. Your goal, of course, is to find the "right spots" for comfort, flow and adaptation of space. In April when MOJO relocated Jazz Jambalaya to the Central ArtSanctuary, we knew that it would take a while to find the "feng shui" of our new venue.

To move forward meant taking on new responsibilities and expenses we hadn't had to deal with before - required event insurance, promoting new location, buying food and service supplies, where to serve the food, how much wine, accept debit/credit cards, indoor and outdoor signage, hire and pay for security, server and bartender, clean up fee. Our April and May JJs were well attended, but presented their own sets of challenges. Following both shows, we sent an internal survey to about 100 MOJO members to get the attendees' opinions. The collected info would help improve things as we adjusted to the new digs. Response rates were 29% and 26.3% respectively. Two month rating averages, some of your comments and a couple things we and can't do:

THE VENUE: Sixty eight percent" excellent"; 29% "very good"

"...this is an excellent venue, good locations, parking, lighting in the parking lot area, security. I hope this will continue to be the venue."

THE FOOD: 34% "excellent"; 28% "very good"

"It's a very fine jambalaya and other excellent food that is always a bit of a surprise. Great desserts."

THE MUSIC: Seventy five percent "excellent"; 18% "very good"

• "Enjoyed the new location. Speaker sound could be better. Recognition program was excellent."

• "Monday night with the Roman Street Band was outstanding. Good music."

THE FOOD & BEVERAGE SERVICE: 33% average (May only)

You spoke often (loudly) about the wait in line, we listened. Here's the new plan: To speed things up, beginning this month food lines on both sides of table, pot luck dishes and desserts in back of Bellingrath Hall. Ideally, dinner service should start no later than 6:45pm. After band boxes are prepared and the kitchen crew says, "We're ready", we'll eat.


