SWING!

Swing music, or simply swing, is a form of popular jazz music developed in the US that dominated in the 1930s and 1940s. The name came from the 'swing feel' where the emphasis is on the off–beat or weaker pulse in the music. Swing bands usually featured soloists who would improvise on the melody over the arrangement. The danceable swing style of big bands and bandleaders such as Benny Goodman was the dominant form of American popular music from 1935 to 1946, a period known as the Swing Era. Notable musicians from that time include Louis Armstrong, Louis Prima, Duke Ellington, Count Basie, Benny Goodman, Artie Shaw, Glenn Miller, Woody Herman, Tommy Dorsey, Jimmy Dorsey, Harry James, Louis Jordan and Cab Calloway.



Swing has roots in the 1920s as larger dance music ensembles began using new styles of written arrangements incorporating rhythmic innovations pioneered by Armstrong and Earl "Fatha" Hines. A typical song played in swing style would feature a strong, anchoring rhythm section in support of more loosely tied wind and brass. Swing music began to decline in popularity during World War II. It influenced the later styles of traditional pop music, jump blues and bebop jazz. The musical style saw a revival in the late 1950s and 1960s with the resurgence of the Count Basie and Duke Ellington orchestras, and popular vocalists, Frank Sinatra, Ella Fitzgerald and Nat King Cole to name a few.

Swing standards are included in the canon of compositions referred to as the Great American Songbook. Tonight's featured performers, Swing, was formed eight years ago with the intent to add its voice to this rich tradition. The group brings musical backgrounds that include classical, rock, musical theatre. Swing adds a unique perspective to the timeless classics from the Songbook. The legacy of the swing generation still reverberates through the experiences of today.


